Household Hazardous Waste

12

HHW is waste from your home that is toxic, corrosive, flammable, or reactive based on its chemical properties. Products such as batteries, paint, paint thinner, solvents, fertilizers, and poisons (pesticides) are considered hazardous waste. Learn about the multiple easy and free ways to safely remove HHW from your home including making an appointment for the next collection event. If a product label states Caution, Warning, Danger, or Poison, it's classified as hazardous waste.

Composting Workshops and Master Composter Program

Composting workshops are two hours and offered throughout the year in-person and on Zoom.

The Master Composter Program is an in-depth multi-week course offered once a year.

Learn how easy and fun it is to recycle your fruit and vegetable scraps, leaves, and plant cuttings into compost! It is rewarding to know you are turning what some consider waste into a nutrient-rich organic material for your garden!

Benefits of Deconstruction Workshops and Master Deconstruction Program

Deconstruction, also referred to as salvage, is a cost-effective and environmentally responsible alternative to conventional building demolition. Deconstruction is the systematic disassembly of a building in order to recover the maximum economic and environmental value of materials through reuse and recycling.

Benefits of Deconstruction workshops are two hours and offered twice a year on Zoom. Learn about the deconstruction process, tax deductions, and how to donate and reuse building materials and incorporate them into your projects.

The Master Deconstruction Program is an in-depth multi-day course that includes classroom instruction and deconstructing a house.

Fixit Clinics/Repair Workshops

Repair workshops are offered throughout the year in collaboration with local libraries in the county. They are fun, community-based workshops where neighbors, friends, and families work collectively to learn how to repair broken items. We provide a workspace, specialty tools, and volunteer Fixit coaches to help you troubleshoot issues and provide routine maintenance for household items such as bikes, textiles, small appliances, computers, and more.
