## Purpose of Presentation

- ▶ Request that the BPAC provide a letter of support for the San Mateo County grant application for the **Multimodal/Parallel Trail Project** construction funding:

Active Transportation Program (ATP) Cycle 4 due July 31, 2018

## Existing Conditions

The project is within Caltrans right of way directly east of Highway 1

- Surfer's Beach/Coronado Street in the North
- Mirada Road/City of Half Moon Bay border in the south

Currently, the only option to travel north/south east of Highway 1 for bicycles and pedestrians is the Highway 1 shoulder.

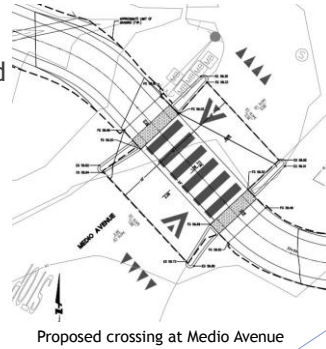

## Proposed Improvements

- ▶ Crosswalk visibility elements
  - ▶ Enhanced signing at side street crossings
  - ▶ Pedestrian scale crosswalk lighting
- ▶ Raised crosswalks to help reduce vehicle speed
