Additional residential recycling or compost carts will be subject to the service fees as listed in the Board of Supervisors Resolution Exhibit B (Unscheduled Service Fees).

NOTICE OF PROPOSED INCREASE IN GARBAGE AND RECYCLABLES COLLECTION SERVICE RATES County Service Area No. 8 (North Fair Oaks area)

effective January 1, 2023

This notice is to advise property owners of the County of San Mateo Board of Supervisors' (Board) proceedings to set rates for garbage and recyclables collection services in County Service Area No. 8 (North Fair Oaks area). Adoption of the rates will result in property related charges, and this notice is, therefore, given in accordance with Proposition 218 and Article XIIID of the California Constitution.

GARBAGE AND RECYCLABLES COLLECTION SERVICE IN NORTH FAIR OAKS

Garbage and recyclables collection services to properties in County Service Area No. 8 (North Fair Oaks area) are provided through a Franchise Agreement between the County of San Mateo and Recology San Mateo County (Recology). The County generates the revenue to pay the collection service provider for the minimum level of service required by the County Ordinance Codes by charging each affected parcel (any parcel containing a dwelling unit) a minimum charge for garbage and recyclables collection on their property tax bill. Commercial parcels and any additional services above the minimum charge on the property tax bill are billed directly by Recology. The County Ordinance Code ("Title 4, Sanitation and Health, Chapter 4.04 Solid Waste Collection, Transport, Storage, and Disposal") defines the Minimum Levels of Service for County Service Area No. 8 parcels as:

- Residential parcels one (1)-64-gallon cart or two (2)-32-gallon carts per dwelling unit.
- ► Apartment House parcels (more than four dwelling units): one (1)-32-gallon cart per dwelling unit.
- Mixed Residential/Commercial and Industrial parcels: one (1)-32-gallon cart per residential dwelling unit and one (1)-32-gallon cart per business.
- Commercial parcels: one (1)-32-gallon cart per business.

SOUTH BAYSIDE WASTE MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY

South Bayside Waste Management Authority (SBWMA), also known as Rethinkwaste.org, is comprised of 11 member agencies: Belmont, Burlingame, East Palo Alto, Foster City, Hillsborough, Menlo Park, Redwood City, San Carlos, the City of San Mateo, the County of San Mateo, and the West Bay Sanitary District. Each member agency has its own franchise agreement with Recology for garbage and recycling collection services within their jurisdictions. The SBWMA provides coordinated waste management related staff services to member agencies and manages the operations of the Shoreway Environmental Center in San Carlos.

PROPOSED RATE INCREASE

The Recology franchise agreement allows for adjustments in Recology's compensation for providing services to the rate payers. To make adjustments for the Calendar Year (CY) 2023, Recology is required to submit a contractor's compensation application based on services provided in CY 2022, and projected costs for service in CY 2023. The SBWMA reviewed data from the Recology compensation application, data from South Bay Recycling (Shoreway Environmental Center operator), and information regarding member agency fees and other associated costs into a consolidated rate report "SBWMA Amended Final Report Reviewing the 2023 Recology Compensation Application, September 15, 2022" (SBWMA 2023 Rate Report).

The cost adjustments recommended in the SBWMA 2023 Rate Report is due primarily to a compensation increase based on Consumer Price indices (fuel and labor costs) and service levels adjustments for the increase in organic collection services.

The Office of Sustainability conducted an analysis of the rates based upon the SBWMA 2023 Rate Report, the projection of the costs, and the current revenue collected and the surplus. Based upon this analysis the Office of Sustainability is recommending applying a portion of the surplus identified in the SBWMA 2023 Rate Report and increase the rates two percent (2.0%) to begin to buy down a portion of the rate increase needed for residential Recology collection services. The recommended two percent (2.0%) rate increase would be applied to the mandatory services (two 32-gallon and one 64-gallon) cart sizes and mixed-use/commercial (32-gallon) cart size to better align rates to the costs of services. The County has not increased rates in the service area since February 2020.

The proposed rates would be effective on January 1, 2023. The charges based on the rates will appear on the property owner's tax bill for FY 2022-23 for all parcels with dwelling units, or per County Ordinance Codes 4.04.200 and 4.04.220, and any additional elective services will be billed directly by Recology. Commercial parcels without dwelling units will continue to be billed by Recology for all services at the current rates. Additionally, any Unscheduled Services (requested by the customer) will be billed directly to the customer by Recology and effective January 1, 2023.

The proposed rate for two 32-gallon garbage carts or one 64-gallon garbage cart for one to four residential dwelling units will be \$36.79 per month (72 cents per month increase). In the past, commercial organic rates were discounted by 25 percent (25%) from the garbage rates for organic collection service to increase subscriptions for services. Due to the SB 1383 mandatory organics collections, staff recommends reducing this discount to 15 percent (15%) of the garbage rate to continue to encourage subscriptions but to also align rates to cover additional costs to manage these new organic commercial programs. The recommended rates will continue to reflect a five percent (5%) franchise fee that will be paid to the County from Recology for administration of these programs.

The franchise agreement also includes fees for Unscheduled Services. The Unscheduled Services are generally those additional elective services that are specifically requested and paid for by the ratepayers in addition to the basic collection service charges. These Unscheduled Services fees are not property related fees. The franchise agreement allows for a Consumer Price Index (CPI) increase to the Unscheduled Services Fees. The Unscheduled Service Fees for CY 2023 reflect a 4.18 percent (4.18%) CPI adjustment to the CY 2022 fees charged by Recology.

The Board of Supervisors has scheduled a Public Hearing on Tuesday, January 17, 2023 at 9:30 a.m. as a hybrid meeting (in person or online) to consider adopting a resolution for the proposed garbage and recyclables collection service rates for County Service Area No. 8 (North Fair Oaks area). The proposed rates are listed in this notice and on the website for the Board's Agenda for their meeting.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 54953(e), the board meeting will be a hybrid meeting, open to the public for both in person participation and via Zoom online meeting format. Anyone interested may appear in person or via Zoom and be heard on this matter or may submit a written statement to the Clerk of the Board. Any property owner in County Service Area No. 8 may file a written protest against the proposed rate increases. Although the Board will consider all input, State law provides that only written protests from property owners may be counted to determine whether a majority protest to the proposed increase exists. The Clerk of the Board must receive a written protest not later than the closing of the Public Hearing specified above to be counted. If a majority protest exists, the Board cannot impose the increased rates. If, at the conclusion of the Public Hearing, a majority protest of property owners does not exist, the Board will consider adoption of the proposed rates. The written protest must include: the property owner's name, property service address, assessor's parcel number (tax assessors parcel number), and the property owner's signature. Written protests may be hand delivered or mailed to the Clerk of the Board at 400 County Center, Redwood City, California 94063. No more than one protest per parcel may be submitted.
