Committee Administration and Purpose



- The San Mateo County Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee was established by Resolution 073998, September, 2015
- Purpose: to advise the Board of Supervisors regarding priorities for bicycle and pedestrian projects and programs



Committee functions are guided by:

- Resolution 073998
- Standing Rules for Boards and Commissions
 - Boards and Commissions Handbook



Advisory recommendation topics include:

- Funding priorities for external grants
- Project priorities and lists
- Education and encouragement programs
- Plans and Policies



Goals of Advisory Recommendations:

- Progress toward Shared Vision Goals https://performance.smcgov.org/shared-vision:
 - o Livable Community
 - o Environmentally-conscious Community
- Improve County's competitive standing for grant funds







Examples of projects and programs:

- Policies or standards for County facilities
- Master plan(s) for pedestrian or bicycle transportation
- Support for grant proposals, e.g., for walkways or cycletracks
- Safe Routes to Schools programs
- Enforcement or Vision Zero programs



Primary SMCBPAC duties, per Resolution:

- Review projects for Transportation Development Act Article 3 grant proposals
- Develop and implement an annual work plan
- Make recommendations on annual road resurfacing, maintenance, Safe Routes to Schools, etc.
- Report to the Board of Supervisors annually



Boards and Commissions Handbook provides:

- Guidelines for how meetings are conducted
- Summarizes simplified Parliamentary Procedure
- Outlines the duties of Chair and members
- Summarizes the requirements of the Brown Act
- Ethics and Conflict of Interest Guidelines



Tips for effective meetings:

- Arrive prepared
- Agree and follow clear ground rules
- Start and end on time agreed to
- Work to be accomplished is clearly defined
- All participants contribute
